

Lent - Growing In Grace

Lent is the season of preparation for the events of Good Friday and Easter Sunday. Like Advent, therefore, it is a 'penitential' season - a season for auditing your life in God's presence and looking for chances to change and to grow.

Lent runs very precisely for forty days - not including Sundays - and so begins on Ash Wednesday and contains six Sundays. The part week it begins with means material has to be provided for the Sunday Before Lent (that used to be called Quinquagesima), even though it will nor usually be used on that Sunday.

Prayers for Weeks

Sunday before Lent - Quinquagesima

Third Sunday in Lent

Everlasting Lord, through your Light of light, may our eyes see ever more clearly in everything you have made that your true power is salvation, your true glory is righteousness, and your true nature is love, shining in every heart. We ask this in the name of that Light, your Son, Jesus Christ. Amen.

Fourth Sunday in Lent

Joy to the world, the world you made, the world you designed, the world you loved;
Joy in our hearts, the hearts you saved, the hearts you dwell in, the hearts you hold dear;
Joy in every heart, that all may know your love, your resurrection, your joy, for ever. Amen.

Fifth Sunday in Lent

Judge us, Lord.
Show our righteousness to be rags.
Show our obedience to be lipservice.
Show our commitment to be empty.
That we might grasp why you still accept us as righteous, obedient and committed to you and to your Name. Amen

Sixth Sunday in Lent

Father and King of all, whose Son laid aside the honour of the throne of heaven and the glory of the eternal Son of God, and instead accepted from a fallen world the glory of a donkey's back and the honour of a cross, may we look for no greater honour, no higher glory than his, wherever you may lead us, through the ages of the ages. Amen.
